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SSPC: the past

- SSPC has been in existence since 2000
- Initiated by Colin Hunter, Graham Buckley, Lewis Ritchie and other
- Initially funded by CSO, Scottish Funding Council, SCPMDE then NES and Scottish Government
- Reflected move to set up research schools across UK at the time



SSPC: the past

- Main strands of work were to:
 - develop programmes of internationally recognised, methodologically rigorous research which address important issues in Scotland and beyond, and
 - ensure higher level career development opportunities for researchers.
- Worked closely with the Scottish Primary Care Research Network (initially integrated with SSPC, now separately funded by the CSO) which has a remit to:
 - increase recruitment to trials and other methodologically rigorous research.
