Halifax regional council voted 12-4 in favour of putting statue of city founder in storage



Supporting person-centred delivery and integrated models of care

ePRO Tool Example:

Supports collaborative goal-setting between patients

and their inter-professional primary care providers

Allows for prioritization of multiple needs aligned to what is most meaningful to patients

Shown to support both patient **and** provider behavior change by prompting new conversations and areas of focus

ePRO Mobile Application and Portal




Patients & providers collaboratively set goals

Patients can view results at home to help with self-management




Providers can view results between visits to help tailor conversations to patient needs
